Skunks are small, nocturnal mammals known for their bold black-and-white stripes and powerful defense—they spray a strong-smelling scent when threatened. They're omnivores and help control pests like insects and rodents.

- The skunk is a member of the Mustelid family, which includes weasel, mink, fisher and otter.
- Mephitis mephitis, the skunk's Latin name, translates appropriately into "bad odor."
- A skunk's smelly spray can reach up to ten feet, and be detected for up to 1.5 miles.
- Immune to snake venom, these animals will eat poisonous snakes such as rattlesnakes.
